The College of Law is one of the core pillars of the University of Buraimi.



1.1 Bachelor of Law (LLB)

1.1.1 Program Information

The College of Law provides the Bachelor of Law Programme, spanning three and a half to four academic years, incorporating a Foundation Programme, carrying (137) credit hours distributed over eight semesters. The study programme is designed to stay abreast of advancements in the legal and judicial domains at local, regional, and global levels. The College is committed to adapting to legal developments on both national and international scales, ensuring a level of effectiveness that aligns with the ongoing scientific, practical, and technical progress in various legal fields.

1.1.2 Admission Requirement

Pass the General Education Diploma or equivalent accredited certificates within the Sultanate.

1.1.3 Program Objective

1.2.2 Admission Requirements

- 1. Applicants must hold a bachelor's degree in law or equivalent and with a grade not less than good.
- 2. Applicants from different academic backgrounds may be considered if they have two years of relevant practical experience in the field of the programme or they must complete four prerequisite courses totaling 12 credit hours as outlined below:

- 3. Applicants with a bachelor's degree in Islamic law from a recognized Sharia college or judicial institute may be admitted, provided that:
- a) Obtain a minimum CGPA of 2.5 on a four-point scale or its equivalent.
- b) Complete a minimum of six prerequisite qualifying courses.
- 4. Applicants specializing in Sharia, with a focus on figh, the purposes of legislation, and the origins of figh, may be admitted, on the condition that they complete six remedial courses, averaging 18 hours, to meet the qualifications for programme enrollment. The specified courses are as follows:

- 6. If the number of applicants surpasses the programme's maximum capacity, the department engages in a selection process among applicants considering both GPA and subject grades relevant to the LLM in private law.
- 7. The candidate should be in good physical health, successfully undergo an interview conducted by the admission committee, and exhibit good conduct.
- 8. Provide recommendation letters from at least two former professors or employers.
